

The Nordic Zebrafish Network is pleased to invite you to this year's Nordic Zebrafish Meeting which will take place on November 13 to 15 in Stockholm, Sweden.

Using zebrafish in research might seem straightforward, but creating reliable data with this powerful model requires a thorough understanding of its biology and husbandry, as well as planning, conducting, and analysis of experiments.

This year's Nordic Zebrafish meeting will bring together animal caretakers, researchers, facility managers, PIs and veterinarians to share knowledge and learn from each other, aiming to produce reliable and reproducible research that makes a difference.

We are very excited to have four distinguished keynote speakers join us:

- Natasha Carp, the Director of Hit Discovery and Biostatistics at AstraZeneca
- Prof. Simon MacKenzie, the Head of the Institute of Aquaculture at the University of Stirling
- Prof. Stephen Renshaw, Sir Arthur Hall Professor of Medicine at the University of Sheffield
- Gregory Paull, the manager of the Aquatic Resource Center at the University of Exeter

Their talks will cover the embedded sex bias in preclinical research, how temperature and thermal choice can affect behavior and immune system, how zebrafish can be used to solve fundamental questions of immunology and what makes zebrafish happy so that your scientific data becomes reliable, relevant and reproducible.

The conference will also feature scientific talks, break-out sessions on zebrafish husbandry, zebrafish imaging and zebrafish as model for immunology, poster presentations, as well as many possibilities to mingle with your peers and establish new collaborations or discuss and solve your challenges. Additionally, we have numerous sponsors that will present their newest equipment and tools that will help and facilitate your daily work.
