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



# Key messages

1. Subjects were **well informed** about the pandemic and adopted a **very low risk behavior**
2. Subjects **limited their contacts with healthcare system** but, when asking, they received it in a satisfactory way
3. Subjects **decreased home care use** but received **more informal care**
4. Subjects were **more worried for others than for themselves**
5. Around **30% of the sample** felt stressed and had feelings of loneliness
- 6. 30% decreased their physical activity**
