Introduction

The IWWD-database was founded in 2015 by investigators from LUMC, Champalimaud, NKI, and A&J Habr-Gama with support of EURECCA and ESSO. Over 2000 patients have been registered up to now. The IWWD aims to collect retrospective and prospective data in order to provide accurate understanding of the risks and benefits of organ preserving strategies in rectal cancer. The prospective information may become the platform for developing best practice guidelines in organ preservation and surveillance. CAST


CAST= Active Monitoring of Cancer AS an AlTernative To Surgery. The goal of CAST is to implement a paradigm change for a novel approach in deciding when or whether cancer surgery is needed. This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions Innovative Training Networks. In total 15 PhD candidates have been appointed and will be trained, in clinical and non-clinical research/tasks.

IWWD news

Participation in the IWWD-consortium means that centres are expected to **include a minimum of 5 new patients annually**. In addition, the follow-up of must be updated at least twice a year (before data locks on 1 April and 1 October). Centres that at the time of the data lock of a particular manuscript have contributed to at least 50 eligible patients over the last 5 years may appoint a co-author. In addition, feedback from this co-author is expected on the manuscript before submission to a journal.

The next data lock for publications will be **1** April **2022**. In order to have your entries checked by the Clinical Research Center, please update them before **1**st of March.

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
