Plastic is a fantastic material, cheep, flexible, stable and possible to use for almost any purpose, which also lead to enormous amounts of waste: "there is more plastic than the total biomass of all people and more than the total mass of all animals" — says Aron Stubbins. Plastic became a new geological material, it exists now at any place on Earth and has chemical properties as none of other material in the history of a planet. The production of plastic is competing now with the natural global life cycle of carbon. The danger from this pollution is discussed in <a href="The global threat from plastic pollution (science.org)">The global threat from plastic pollution (science.org)</a>. H.P. Arp and colleagues suggest to drastically <a href="Teduce">Teduce</a> the use of disposable plastic in addition to better <a href="Sorting">Sorting</a> and <a href="Tecycling">Tecycling</a>. Moreover, the production and import/export of plastic needs to be regulated <a href="pollitically">politically</a>.

Experimental research is a plastic-consuming branch. Send for re-cycling all plastic that has not been in contact with biological material! We are also individuals, and in our private life we can Reduce, Reuse and Recycle PLASTIC.
