Karolinska Institutet Prize for Research in Medical Education (KIPRIME) 2026

General information

The purpose of the KIPRIME is to recognize and stimulate high-quality research in medical education, thereby promoting long-term improvements in educational practices. 'Medical' includes all education and training within any health science profession. Nominees shall have made outstanding, and internationally recognized, contributions to research in medical education. Your nomination(s) may be based on not only studies made in a health science setting, but also on other research relevant to medical education. The nominee's findings must have been published in internationally and generally available journals or books. All key publications must be available in English. Read more at the Karolinska Institutet Prize for Research in Medical Education.

Guidelines for nomination

Nominations are accepted from anyone interested in the field of research in medical education. To be considered for the Prize in 2026, your nomination must have reached the Prize Committee **no later than 10th of September 2025.** Nominations received will be confirmed by e-mail to the nominator.

Note 1: We will only consider new nominations or updated nominations from previous period. This implies that that we will not consider older, not updated nominations.

Note 2: We will not accept joint nominations. Each nominated person will be assessed individually. However, the Prize can be shared between two individually nominated persons.

Nominator

State your name, title, and professional position, address, e-mail, and telephone number. The Prize Committee may contact you for further information.

Nominee

State the nominee's name, title, and professional position, address, email, and telephone number.

Motivate your nomination (maximum five pages) by describing:

- The nominee's most important research findings.
- The relevance of the findings, either for medical education in general or for a specific field within health sciences education.
- Impact of the nominee's research results on educational practice and/or studies by other researchers.
- References for up to ten key publications within the field of medical education with the nominee as a principal investigator.
